VE Day 80th Celebrations



On Thursday 8th May, the whole school turned red, white and blue to commemorate 80 years since Victory in Europe (VE) Day. We all enjoyed a rather blustery picnic lunch out on the oasis on the playground. I think Tina's VE Day cakes were definitely everyone's favourite.

I also wonder who spotted an ex-pupil Charlie Raynor, (one of Angela Raynor's sons) at the VE Day celebrations in London sitting alongside King Charles and the other Royals?

Log Books were kept for school for many years from when it opened in 1891. Some of the events:

September 4th 1939: The school is closed because the country is at war with Germany. A stirrup pump and container for fighting incendiary bombs was delivered to the school. Inspectors still visited but now they inspected Air Raid drills rather than arithmetic. On 3rd September, 1940 it was time to put that drill into practice. "Attendance was affected this morning after an AR warning during the night." During the last 4 months of 1940 twenty-four raids or alerts were recorded. Throughout the war at odd intervals, children arrived to school who had been evacuated from places like London and Guernsey. In 1945 the War also ended with VE Day being celebrated by a Thanksgiving Service in the school hall and two days holiday. The holiday mood continued for a little longer as, on their return on 11th May children who were late were "treated tolerantly" ... but this didn't last long!
